JERSEY AIRPORT - PROPOSED CHANGE TO LICENCE CONDITIONS

INITIAL NOTICE

The Jersey Competition Regulatory Authority ('JCRA') received an application from Jersey Airport to add Jersey Electricity Limited ('JE') to the User Group of the Terrestrial Trunked Radio ('TETRA') System. The TETRA System is a technology that has been deployed in several jurisdictions for the provision of mobile wireless communications to the emergency services. In Jersey, the TETRA system is operated on behalf of the TETRA User Group under the licence issued to Jersey Airport under the Telecommunications (Jersey) Law 2002 (the 'Licence').

On 13 December 2005, the JCRA published consultation paper 2005-4 *Operation of the TETRA System in Jersey*, inviting comments from stakeholders on how this service should be managed within the Island. In general, consultees did not have any specific objection to JE being admitted to the TETRA User Group, provided that the use of the service was to enable efficient management of resources under emergency conditions. As a result of this process, the JCRA proposes to grant Jersey Airport's request to add JE to the TETRA User Group. It proposes to implement this change by adding JE to the list of TETRA System Users in Schedule C of the Licence.

Copies of this notice and the proposed change to the Licence are available for inspection at the offices of the JCRA at 6th Floor, Union House, Union Street, St Helier, Jersey, between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm Monday to Friday. This Initial Notice supersedes that dated 28 March 2006.

It is intended that the proposed changes to the Licence will become effective on 7 July 2006.

Written representations or objections to the exercise of these specified regulatory functions may be made by letter marked for the attention of the Executive Director, JCRA and delivered to 6th Floor, Union House, Union Street, St Helier, Jersey, JE2 3RF on or before 6 July 2006.
