

At what point does a body such as this - safe guarding the security of the islands gateway, primarily to the UK, but also contingent - become a profit Centre?

- individual profitability of each separate business model and comparison to equivalents elsewhere - to determine cross contamination of business models....Marinas, with ports (ports of entry), with coastguard
- That any “cross funding” from one business to another should be clearly treated as - market competitive - “loans”, thus enduring and demonstrating fairness and good operating practice within each of the “division” and promote completion (from private sector). One group should not be unfairly priced to subsidize another.

Surely the core focus of this entity should/must be securing a resilient gateway :

- Non profit making
- Providing “gateway” services that provide resilient, safe and leading/gold levels of service.

Everything else should be seen as ripe for privatization, competition and properly regulated by existing business/corporate law. Not “pseudo” government and uncompetitive empire..... We struggle with JT and JEC, let's not - albeit too late - at Ports to the list.
